As the Community Action Alliance for Southeast Michigan continues to implement the WRAP program throughout the GLWA service area, Wayne Metro as the current program administrator acknowledges and agrees that transition of certain roles and responsibilities should shift to our partnering service providers to meet the following objectives: Increased community outreach and engagement directly to households to further promote awareness and access to the program and other supportive services and to empower communities impacted by high levels of poverty to be active partners with the program structure.
