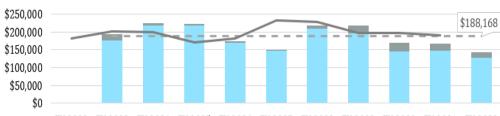

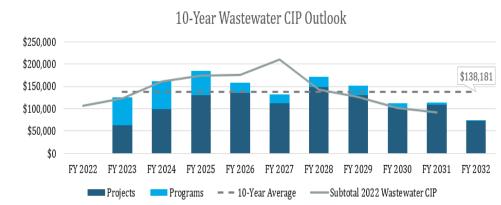

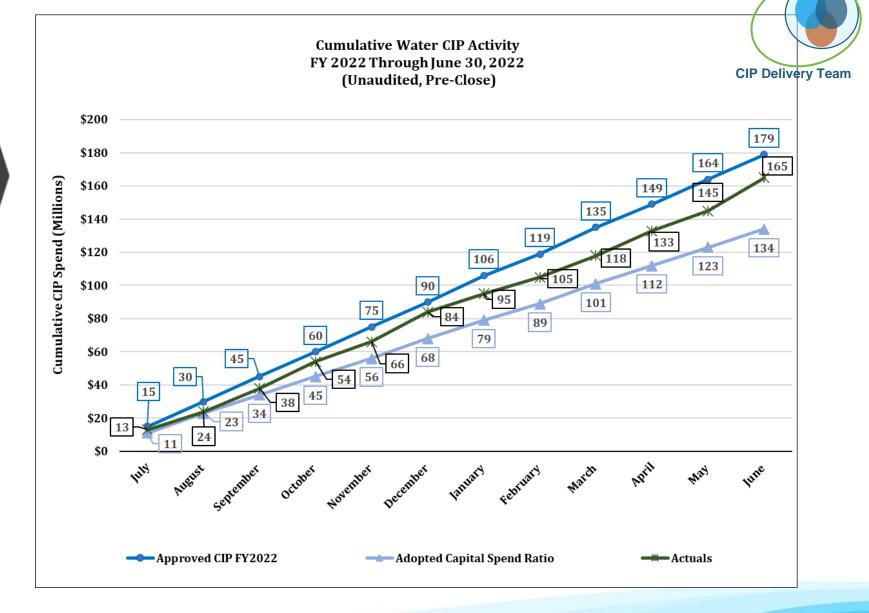


#### Enterprise Resiliency FY 2022 Total Water CIP Spend

The water system incurred \$165 million of CIP costs through June 2022.

This is 92% of the FY 2022 monthly prorated Approved CIP and 123% of the Adopted Capital Spend Ratio amount.



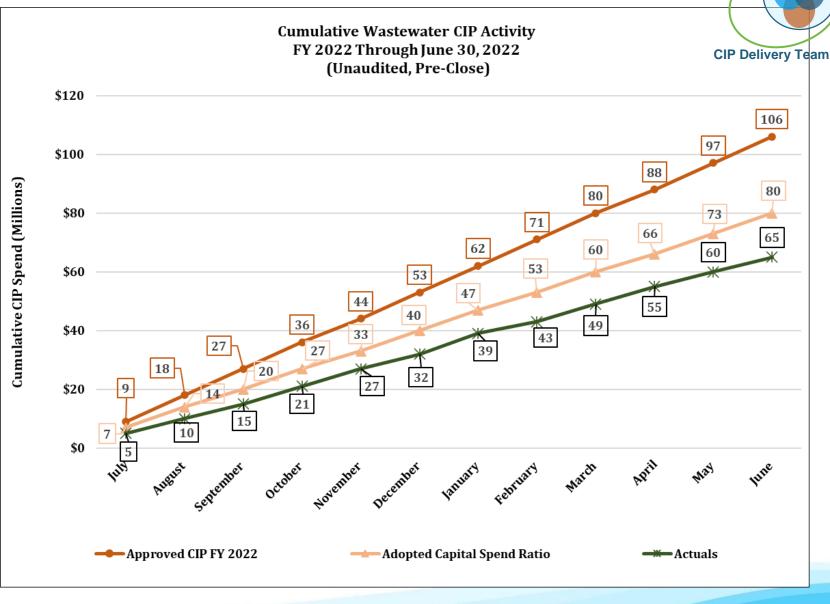


#### Enterprise Resiliency FY 2022 Total Sewer CIP Spend

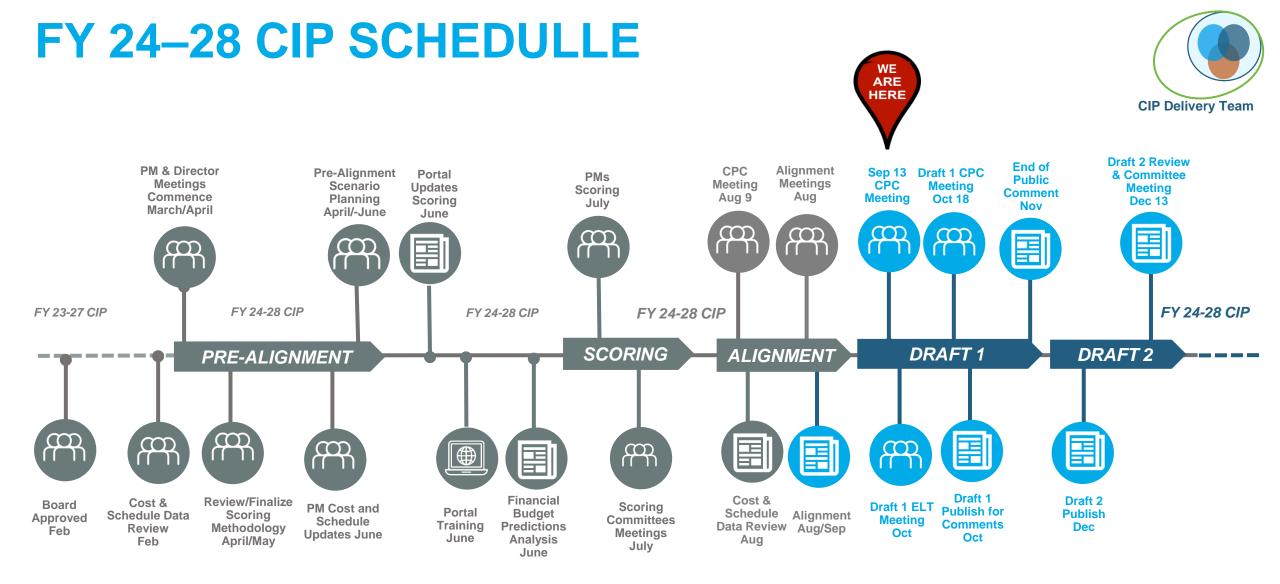
**Current Status:** 

The sewer system incurred \$65 million of CIP costs through June 2022.

This is 61% of the FY 2022 monthly Prorated Approved CIP and 81% of the Adopted Capital Spend Ratio amount.





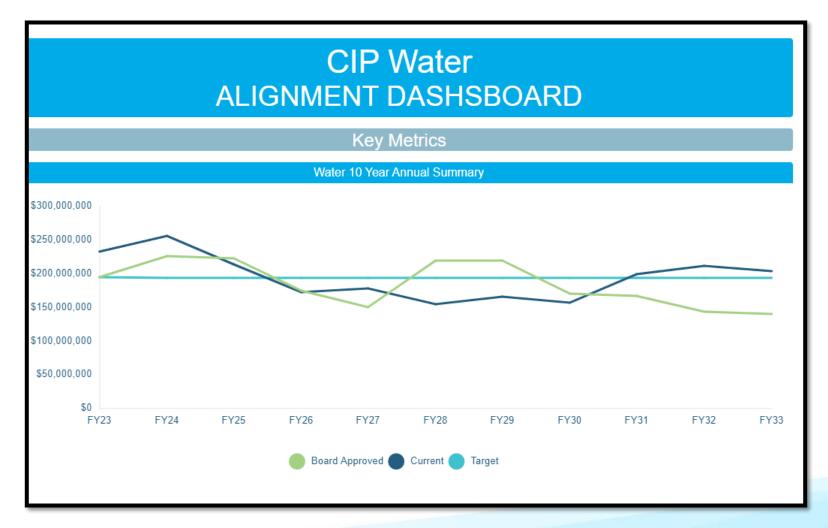
