Section 1	Director Munfakh: Section 1 Introduction. Distinguish between Vendor Services and Professional Services.
	Response: This could be accomplished in the definitions.
4.4	Director Munfakh: Sec. 4.4 Pre-Qualification of Vendors. We should publish a list of pre-qualified vendors with each specific discipline. MDOT does this now.
	Response: This could be accomplished in the Procurement Procedures.
5.1	Director Munfakh: Sec. 5.1 Solicitation Development and Advertisement. Would like every solicitation to indicate how the bid/proposal will be evaluated. For example, how many points is assigned to each evaluation category.
	Response: This is largely done now and will be incorporated into the procurement procedures.
5.4	Director Munfakh: Sec. 5.4 Professional Services. Eliminate "competitive" in the first sentence.
	Response: Director Munfakh is going to send an example of why "competitive" should not be before "QBS method."
5.5.3	Director Munfakh: Sec. 5.5.3 Value Engineering. Wants Value Engineering as a requirement.
	Response: To be discussed at Board meeting.
5.8	Director Munfakh: Sec. 5.8 Bonds. Would like a Labor and Materials Bond as well.
	Response: GLWA requires a Payment Bond (Surety Bond) that covers subcontractors and suppliers to be in case of default.
6.1	Director Munfakh: Sec. 6.1 Advertisement. "and/or" should be changed to "and." Believes Procurement should advertise in print media as well as on Bonfire.
	Response: GLWA is considering other supplemental sources that are cost effective. GLWA's projects currently are listed in Dodge Reports and Construction Association of Michigan (CAM) communications.

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7.2	Director Munfakh: Sec. 7.2 Responses Submitted After Due Date and Time. Believes Procurement should not open the late submittals.
	Response: GLWA no longer accepts paper copies of bid submittals. They are submitted on Bonfire where there is an electronic date/time stamp and permanently recorded. All late submittals are not open in Bonfire.
8.3	Director Munfakh: Sec. 8.3 Protest. Recommends that the CPO not make the bid protest decision because there could be a bias. Instead, recommends a committee of three that would make the decision. Is O'K with Chief Administrative & Compliance Officer handling the appeal.
	Response: To be discussed at Board Meeting.
10.2.1	Director Munfakh: Sec. 10.2.1 Approval Requirement Table. Recommends only having two approval levels: (1) \$499,999 and under: CEO approved; and (2) \$500,000 and over: Board approval.
	Response: To be discussed at Board Meeting.
11.2.1	Director Munfakh: Sec. 11.2.1 Term Change Orders. Take out "may" in the first sentence so the sentence now reads "Change Orders or amendments that extend the term of a Contract require reauthorization."
	Response: Agreed.
11.3	Director Munfakh: Sec. 11.3 Change Order Directive (CCD). Recommends issuing a Change Order after the CCD is approved.
	Response: Construction Change Directive (CCD) funding is taken from the provisional allowance which is established and included in the original contract approval. Therefore, no Change Order is required.
12.1	Director Munfakh: Sec. 12.1 Contract Compliance. Recommends taking out "CPO" in the last sentence. Only wants the CEO to have the authority to terminate a contract in this situation.
	Response: To be Discussed at Board Meeting.
Comment	Director Munfakh: Does not see anything in the Proposed Policy regarding Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) or Women Business Enterprise (WBE) certified firms having preferences. Understands that GLWA is a regional authority so cannot have Detroit based companies having a preference.
	Response: No public organization in Michigan can have preferences for MBE and WBE companies according Proposition 2 passed several years ago. In addition, GLWA's Articles of Incorporation (Article 9L) indicate that there shall be no quotas or set-asides.
