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Provisionary Allowance is an amount included in the Contract Price to reimburse the Consultant for the cost to furnish and perform Work that is uncertain. Any remaining balance upon Final Completion shall be retained by the GLWA and not paid to the Consultant.

Negotiation Strategy: This procurement was intended to result in two separate unit price contracts, each of which would perform preventative maintenance and repair for equipment within separate portions of the water and wastewater systems. Each contract was to have a 42-month initial term including 36 months of maintenance and repair through substantial completion, followed by six months before final completion to complete reports and close-out the contract. Each contract was also to include up to two one-year extensions.

Upon evaluation of the proposals received it became clear that the prices quoted by the second and third bidders were respectively 78.8% and 102.1% higher than the low bid. (See tabulation below under "Evaluation and Scores.") Consequently, staff determined that instead of entering into a second contract with one of these bidders, it would be in GLWA's interest to focus negotiation on procuring a single favorable contract with the low bidder to perform all of the required work.

During the negotiation, staff confirmed that the low bidder possesses sufficient capability to perform the entire scope of work initially planned for two contracts. Staff also clarified the bid to confirm that all specified work was included and that no errors had been identified in the bid. Assumptions stated in the selected proposal were discussed, resulting in addition of several new unit prices to address types of equipment inadvertently omitted from the initial RFP. An additional unit price was also requested by staff for enhanced testing of motor control centers (MCCs) at CSO facilities in lieu of MCC inspections initially specified.

Negotiated contract quantities were then increased to provide for work initially intended to be included in both contracts, and appropriate unit price reductions were negotiated commensurate with the expanded scope of work. The result was a cost of \$5,717,480.00 for the initial contract term to provide work that that was initially intended to be included in two contracts. This negotiated amount compares favorably with the cost of \$7,658,504.88 that would otherwise have resulted for two separate contracts for the initial term based on the two lowest bids received. Finally during negotiation, not-to-exceed amounts were added to provide funding for the two one-year contract extensions, bringing the total contract price to \$9,702,372.98.



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The attached detailed cost tabulation shows the development of the negotiation from the initial low bid of \$2,747,331.35 for one of two contracts during the initial contract term, followed by negotiated unit price adjustments and addition of new unit price items for one of two contracts resulting in a price of \$3,002,583.35. Finally, to replace the two planned contracts with a single contract, quantities were increased, and further unit price reductions negotiated, resulting in an amount of \$5,717,480.00 for the base contract term. This amount increases to \$9,702,372.98 when not-to-exceed funding is added for two potential one-year extensions.

Benchmarking was completed by comparing the proposals for this project. This analysis confirmed that overall, rates offered by the selected proposer are in competitive range and very favorable. The rate comparisons and allowances (if any) are illustrated in the attached document labeled cost tabulation.
